Some Highlights of Federation's Living Bridge Initiatives

OUR PARTNERSHIPS include five communities in Israel and one in Cherkassy, Ukraine. As a nationally renowned leader in this field, we are proud of our 25 years of partnership with Ofakim/Merchavim; our 20-year partnership with Kibbutz Erez; and decades of partnership with Arad. Our partnership with the Ethiopian Israeli community in Rishon LeZion dates back to 1977, prior to the Ethiopian Aliyah. In addition, we are the only Federation in the nation with a partner relationship that connects a Diaspora Jewish community to a non-Jewish community, the Druze village of Hurfeish in the upper Galilee. Our Federation supports programs in these partner communities and also works to determine which projects are most critical to community development.

MISHLACHAT (Israel emissaries) bring Israel to life in Greater MetroWest through an authentic Israel presence and connections. In partnership with the Jewish Agency for Israel (JAFI), our Federation maintains one of the largest delegations of emissaries in North America. It includes *rishonim* (high school graduates who defer their army service for a year to spend a "year of service" in our community) and *shlichim* (Israeli professionals who spend several years as emissaries in our Federation). Together,

the *mischlachat* work in more than 40 synagogues, schools, and agencies throughout our community and engage with more than 9,000 people annually.

PEOPLEHOOD PROJECT is a fulfilling two-year leadership training program and encounter for Greater MetroWest community members with members of our Negev partnerships. Together they build long-lasting bonds with one another and with the larger Jewish world. Participants travel to Israel, host their peers in NJ, and together visit a third Diaspora Jewish community.

DILLER TEEN FELLOWS is a premier leadership development program for teens in Greater MetroWest and our partner community of Rishon LeZion. The program empowers its fellows to be active leaders with a commitment to making the world a better place (*tikkun olam*) and developing a strong Jewish identity and sense of belonging to their community, the larger Jewish world, and Israel.

Our Federation, together with generous donors, has supported these Living Bridge initiatives.
